We provide housing advice, support and related services to help young people make the difficult transition to living independently in the community.

Our services include:

- **Pre Tenancy Service** - support for young people aged 18-25 years, who have issues around housing.
- **Floating Support** - offering young people age 16 -25 support in their own tenancies or in the transitional period towards independent living.
- **St Peters Court** - A complex of sixteen self-contained fully furnished apartments. The development is specifically designed for former armed services personnel.
- **Hollyacre Centre** - A complex of self-contained apartments. The development is specifically designed for former armed services personnel.
- **Plan 4 Life** - SHAID and DurhamWorks Plan 4 Life programme is for people aged 16 -24 living in County Durham. This project approaches your educational and employment dreams in an informal, creative and fun environment.
- **SHAID House** - SHAID House is a supported housing project for young people aged 16-25, the property consisting of 7 fully furnished studio apartments based in the heart of Annfield Plain.
