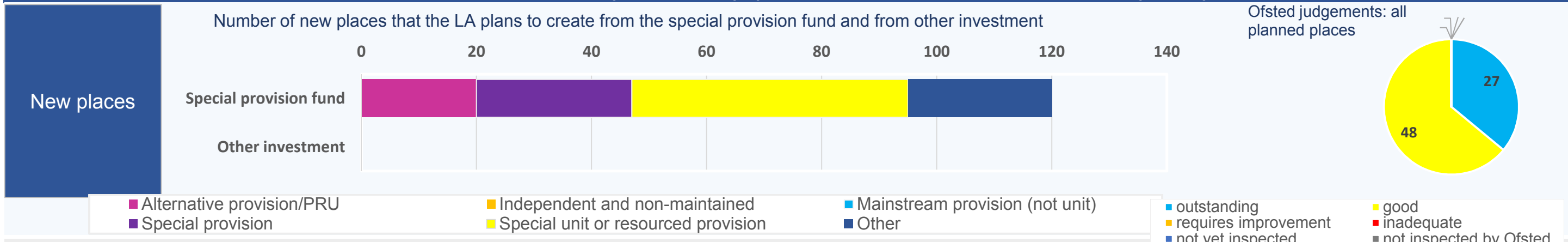

The project will comprise of refurbishment and reconfiguration of an area of the school (Thomas Aveling is a mainstream secondary school) to provide suitable and appropriate classrooms for pupils with hearing impairments as well as offices/meeting spaces for the specialist staff.

The project will include the replacement of the current out-dated and dilapidated detached modular building used to teach the ASD students with a contemporary area within the main school buildings to better facilitate integration wherever possible. The improved and extended specialist learning environments will encourage the social and educational developments of the pupils.

The LA supports the development of extended outreach resources and training by Bradfields, to enable greater partnership working with other schools and academies across Medway, which will benefit the wider population of children.
